

# Food Act 2014

## Proposed Transition Schedule

### National programme Level 3 (NP3)

#### Moderate Risk Food Retailers and Manufacturers

These will likely be registered under the Food Hygiene Regulations 1974 and will cover most of the minor food outlets like dairies and could include some larger stores such as 'superettes'.

Below includes the types of businesses and the transition schedules:

	Processors of herbs or spices	Processors of grain
	Retailers that handle food (but do not prepare or manufacture food)	Manufacturers of oils and fats for human consumption
	Manufacturers of food additives, processing aids, vitamins, minerals and other nutrients intended to be added to food	Manufacturers of dry mix powders
	Manufacturers of non alcoholic beverages	Brewers, distillers, manufacturers of vinegar, alcoholic beverages or malt extract

#### Notes:

A small food outlet may flick between FCP or NP3 by introducing or removing a food processing component (eg making up filled bread rolls, sandwiches or cooking fries). All NP processor may also choose to move to a higher risk management tool if they wish.

A food businesses with multiple sectors may choose to register each sector under its own type (eg NP1 and NP3) or elect to operate under the highest applicable risk type (eg NP3).
